

Vietnam Veterans Memorial Week

Vietnam veterans will be honored at the 2017 Vietnam Memorial Exhibit from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, 22 April through Friday 28 April at the Fargo Air Museum. The event is presented by Vietnam Veterans of America, Chapter 941, Northern Warriors.

The opening ceremony begins at 10 a.m. 22 April. Dan Stenvold, president of North Dakota Vietnam Veterans of America and Dem-NPL Sen. Richard Marcellais of Belcourt will be in attendance. There will be a Presentation of Colors by American Legion Post 262, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4516, Vietnam Veterans Chapter 941, and the Canadian Veterans Color Guard.

On 23 April two guest speakers will be at the Air Museum: Vet Center readjustment counselor Jim Cronin at 11:30 a.m., who will discuss post-traumatic stress disorder, followed at 1 p.m. by National Agent Orange Committee Chair Maynard Kaderlik, who will present "Faces of Agent Orange - Our Children and Grandchildren."

The exhibit will include era-specific aircraft and vehicles, a traveling North Dakota and Canadian Vietnam Memorial wall, artwork and military memorabilia. Admission is free for Vietnam veterans, their immediate family, museum members and children under 18; and \$10 for others.
