At our local candidate forums, you may have seen some of our Veterans wearing those buttons. My thanks go out to our local residents who attended the forums, we had 140 at the Mayor and City Council forum, 56 at the House 4A and 4B, County Commission and Sheriff forums and over 40 at the Moorhead School Board forum. I've had the honor of moderating forums in Moorhead and in Fargo. The League is a fantastic group of volunteers whose primary goal is make sure our voters are educated and understand major public policy issues. The League is nonpartisan although several of the members do belong to political parties, but Democrat and Republican.
